Words from The Rev. Les Ferguson, Assistant Spiritual Director

Romans 11:29: ...for the gifts and the calling of God are irrevocable. (NRSV)

What is it that we are called to do with our lives, both as Christians and as people who are citizens of God's creation? For most, the search for call and for appreciation of our gifts is a lifelong endeavor. In the end, we must live with the uncertainty associated with our understanding of God and God's call on our lives. But that doesn't mean we should not try or hesitate in responding to what we hear from God.

I read an article recently about a colleague where he described how he heard his call to ordination. He stated that he had gone to chapel to pray and while there he offered this, "My answer is yes. What is your question God?" The arc of his ministry was formed by those simple, but challenging words.

We have been assured that God has a plan for us and that, regardless our efforts to drag our feet in following that plan, God's plan will prevail. We know that God's plan for us is health and wholeness, connection to a community, and the variety of gifts God gives that community to thrive. Our response to God's plan is "simple," to work together towards a common goal, to capitalize on each other's gifts, and to spend time searching for God's plan for us - even in the uncertainty of our lives.

What gets in our way? In essence, we are hampered by fear. Fear of change and what society tells us when they say that change implies that we failed. Fear that what lies ahead is difficult, partly because it is different and uncomfortable. Fear of being unable to predict with certainty that we really hear God clearly.

Yet we are taught that the work we do seeking God is never a loss. Part of the beauty of God's kingdom is our understanding of God and our call depends on attempts and pauses to evaluate what happened. And, more importantly, that work cannot succeed when we are alone, living without Spiritual Direction and reflection. Our job as Cursillistas is to capitalize on the tools we have been provided; and to welcome others into a loving community of seekers, to make a friend, be a friend, and bring a friend (closer) to Christ. The life we live in community is not perfect or without hiccups, but it will help us draw closer to the end that God has in store.

I leave you with this question to ponder and share with your Group Reunions and Spiritual Directors, "What would our ministry as Christians and Cursillistas look like if we offered the prayer my friend did, 'my answer is yes. What is your question God'?"

Looking to expand these areas to our Cursillo Community! Come grow with us!

Facebook Page Moderator:

A caring individual knowledgeable in the skills needed to moderate the Cursillo Facebook Page or willing to make themselves knowledgeable and who has time for such a task. Moderator is to decline or allow posts ensuring that the Page is not abused and that posts remain current. Posts will include events that may be of interest to the community, weekend announcements, prayer requests, general community news and when no such input is needed a generic inspirational post in line with Cursillo principles may be posted to keep the page relevant. Posting is expected on an "as needed" basis but not daily except for urgent prayer requests as they may come in.

Newsletter Layout Artist:

A skilled and creative individual with some experience in Newsletter layout is needed to format Articles and news items that will be provided by the Secretariate and by the community at large in an attractive and appealing way. The newsletter is published seasonally four times a year. Publication of the newsletter will be done by the Secretariate Technical Chairperson to our e-mail list. Some amount of nagging the Secretariate for content may be required. Publication of parts taken from the national Cursillo literature to fill space is acceptable but should not dominate the content.

Safe Church Trainer:

Are you already a Trainer for your Parish? Are you willing to become one? The dioceses requires that all members of the Cursillo Secretariate and all members serving on a Cursillo Team must have completed the Safe Church

Training offered by the dioceses. They also offer training for those wishing to become Trainers in their parish. Cursillo would like to have a Trainer available to the Rector who is building a team to make it as easy as possible to complete the requirements. A Certificate of completion is required for each team member to serve. Having a trainer in several areas of the Diocese would be ideal.

Special Event Organizers by geographical area:

It was suggested during the last ECLW that a community focused service event such as picking up trash on a section of the Bay or the River might help to strengthen our Cursillo community. This is not intended to be an ongoing scheduled happening. From experience we know there are often willing workers for worthy community projects if the call goes out for a specific day and time. Do you have passion for a project in your community? Are you the right person to motivate your fellow Cursillistas to join you? Just Start and end with the Cursillo prayer and get the job done. The Secretariate will help you with requests and announcements.

Secretariate Members:

This vineyard is more demanding, but the rewards are amazing. Last year one position became vacant without volunteers to fill the position. We shifted responsibilities to accommodate the loss. This coming January four more positions will become vacant. All 4 of these positions were filled by folks who have already served extra years so as not to leave a vacancy. We are struggling to remain viable while attempting to revitalize Cursillo in Southern Virginia. We are in desperate need of willing and dedicated workers to bring in the harvest. While we miss the community of meeting face to face, and we still try to do so when possible, Zoom meetings make the job much easier now. We invite you to be part of this group who love the Cursillo ministry and grow with us.
