A MESSAGE FROM OUR LAY DIRECTOR MARK CROSTHWAITE

My Cursillo Family,

It's with great joy that I share some exciting news as we prepare for **Cursillo Weekend #175!** Our own John Vance is faithfully leading the charge as Rector, and his team is already hard at work preparing for what promises to be a Spirit-filled weekend this fall.

As we await our candidates, I encourage each of you to prayerfully reach out to your brothers and sisters in Christ who have not yet experienced a Cursillo weekend. Sometimes all it takes is an invitation and a gentle nudge to say "yes" to a life-changing encounter with Christ.

A Personal Reflection

Let me take you back in time—over 25 years ago—when I made my own Cursillo weekend in the Diocese of Indianapolis. I was active in church, believed deeply in God, and desired to follow Christ. Yet over time, my spiritual life had become... predictable. I sensed that something was missing.

Cursillo offered me the chance to reconnect—not just with Christ, but with His call to live as His disciple in the daily rhythms of life. Over the course of those three short days, I experienced grace in a profoundly personal way. Through powerful talks, deep prayer, genuine worship, and open-hearted conversations, I rediscovered what it means to be fully alive in Christ. And then came something even more beautiful: Christian community.

People I had never met became dear friends—companions on the journey—who reminded me that we are never meant to walk alone. That same sense of community is still alive today, here in Southern Virginia, through our 4th Day gatherings, weekends, and everyday friendships rooted in grace.

An Invitation

So, take a moment. Look around your parish. Is there someone you know who seems hungry for something more—someone feeling the nudge to go deeper in their faith?

Invite them. Encourage them. Walk with them.

Cursillo is not just a retreat—it's a beginning. A doorway to a renewed vision of Christ's love in action and a clearer understanding of our role in His body, the Church.



Let's keep the spirit of Cursillo alive and growing as we look toward the fall. Applications for Cursillo #175 are now open—and we would love nothing more than to welcome new pilgrims to the table.

CURSILLO #175 FALL WEEKEND OCT. 2-5, 2025 SAVE THE DATE!

"My name is John Vance, I attend St. Matthias Episcopal Church in Midlothian Virginia, I made Cursillo number 96 in the Diocese of Southern Virginia, and I sat at the table of St. John." (Actually, I don't remember my table name, so I thought St. John would be easier to recall.)

How many times have you heard such an introduction? Even if you only attended your own weekend, you heard it a lot, and with each team you may have served on you heard it many more. Looking at the Cursillo data I see that the first weekend in the Diocese of Southern Virginia was in the spring of 1978. After 47 years and 168 weekends (some weekends had numbers, but did not occur) how is it that Cursillo is still going on? Even though the weekends are basically the same, each is still unique and offering something that we all yearn for with every fiber of our being, the **theme of every Cursillo weekend:** An Encounter with Christ.

Cursillo #175 is being held at Camp Chanco the weekend of October 2-5 with team meetings starting July 19 at St. Matthias' in Midlothian. We currently have a unique and talented team of 35 with a prayer team of four, and though this group will be going through the same weekend structure that has happened 168 times before, the weekend will be unique. There has never been this combination of people, coming together at this particular time to put on a weekend in just this way.

In trying to build a team I have already encountered Christ is so many individuals with so many gifts they would like to share. Gifts ranging from a mastery of music to simply being a calming spiritual presence. As the Apostle Paul describes we have many members, playing many roles, but we are all one team. So, there will be many gifts to share, and many ways to make the presence of Christ known.

With such a team it will be a great opportunity not only to serve, but to serve those to be attending the weekend. Chanco in the fall with the changing trees, and the vast expanse of the James River is an enchanting time and place. A place where people can not only encounter the Christ in each other, and through the liturgy, but through the environment.

Time is running out to put your application in for Team 175, but it is also critical that candidates for the fall weekend begin to submit their applications. It will be a spirit-filled weekend, and we would like to share this blessing with as many people as possible. So, pray about who you feel would be blessed by this weekend, and talk to them about it. Be a friend, and bring that friend to Christ, as Christ will be the most important member of the team this weekend.

Words from The Very Rev. Dr. Susan Grimm

Head Spiritual Director



It's about this time every year that I am again reminded how early the kids go back to school these days! In my rural county, children and teachers will be back in the classroom on August 11.

I have begun to use that sudden reminder for myself! Each time August rolls around, I begin to do some new study. Remember study? One of the three legs of our stool of piety, study, and action! Of the three I think study often gets the least attention, but is incredibly important for our growth as Christians.

Study doesn't have to be hard. And it's not always just reading a book! As you might recall from your weekend, these days study could be listening to a podcast or an audio book while you drive down the road on your daily commute or a long trip. Study could also be learning how to do something you've never done before, like making an Anglican rosary and learning to use it as part of your daily prayer life. Perhaps study could be learning how to play the guitar, so that you can participate in worship at the nursing home or assisted living center!

In the past, I have found that my group has been a great source of ideas for what my study might be or look like. And if you are a book junkie like me, my friends always know I'm up for the suggestion of something new to read! Here are a few suggestions of things I have read or studied that have informed my faith:

Are you fond of knowing the history of things? One of the best histories of the church I have read in the last 20 years is Dermaid McCullough's *Christianity: the First 3000 Years*.

It is written historically, but also topically, so if you want to know something about the early Christian church in Asia, you can easily do that. It is also available on Audible, so I was able to listen to portions of it on a long drive.

Would you like to know more about the theology of the church? Or the Book of Common Prayer? Try The New Church's Teaching Series. While it's not so new anymore, it has some excellent small volumes on ethics, history, the BCP, prayer, etc. There are 13 volumes, and I think you will likely find them in some church libraries, or secondhand.

Want to know more about our call to environmental stewardship? I found *Tomatoland* an excellent exposition on how factory farming practices have changed how we eat and how we work. Another older book, but now in its third edition. For me this book began an increased awareness of the many costs of our food production today, not just the dollars and cents.

You might also look around for a group that's doing a particular book study in a topic area that interests you. I specifically recommend the online book groups run by our Diocesan staff, including Canons Willis Foster and Lynn Farlin.

These days, the opportunities for study are endless! I encourage you to check around with your friends, clergy, and online to find some new sources or new topics that might interest you. And I'm always up for a conversation about a topic that might interest you.



EUISIO WHAT IS THE FOURTH DAY?



The Cursillo experience takes place over a period of three days. Each day thereafter is known as the "Fourth Day." It is during these Fourth Days that the participant puts into practice what was learned during the weekend thus becoming a more committed follower of Jesus Christ and active church participant. A major goal of Cursillo is to develop a more genuine "Life in Grace" which has three primary elements: Life in Piety - Giving our hearts to God. Growth through Study - Giving our minds to God. Christian Action - Giving our hands and feet to God.

Although the Cursillo experience can never be repeated as a participant, there are many ways to stay involved: Group Reunions; Community Gatherings; Sponsorship; Working on a Team.

All these things contribute to our growth in our relationship with each other and Christ. The purpose of the weekend is to help us put into action our 4th Day which is the rest of our lives.
